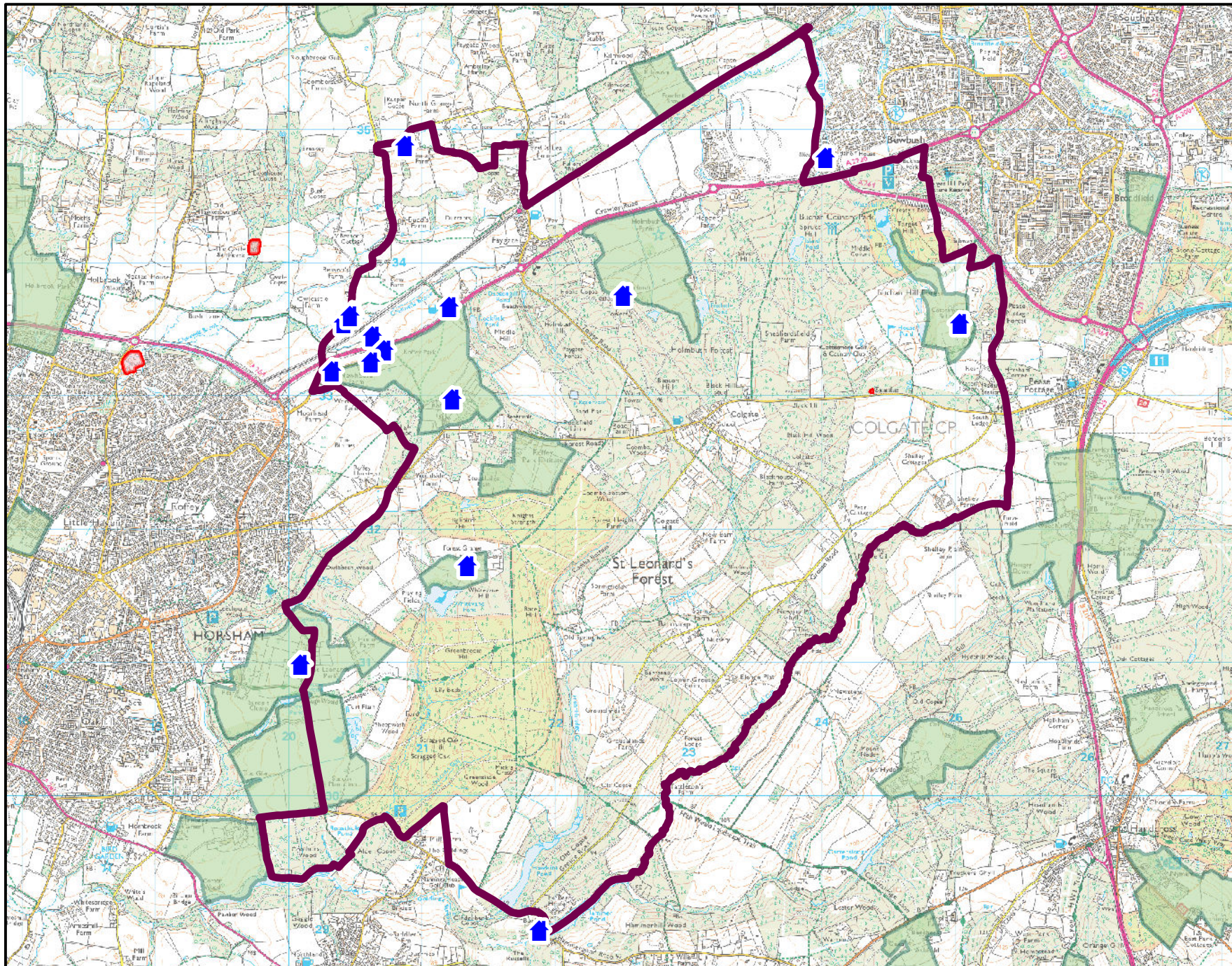

Casement windows. C19 wing with tiled roof added to north. Gable end to each wing. Crown post roof and smoke blackened rafters. Remains of sooted wattle and daub partitions. Stone chimney stack of C16 or early C17 backs on to the hall'.

Large house later private school. Built in 1913 and probably also designed by J P McGraw a civil engineer. Jacobean style. Built of red brick in English bond with Bath stone dressings, Horsham stone slab roof and clustered brick chimney stacks. An asymmetrical building roughly L-shaped of 2 storeys and attics with irregular fenestration. Entrance front has central and right end projecting gables with kneelers and ball finials. 3 clustered brick chimney stacks and 4 flat roofed dormers. Other windows are mullioned with ground floor mullioned and transomed 3-light window in right end gable. Central gable has 4 centred arched doorway with side lights and above stone panel with shield held by dragons of Saint Leonards's Forest. L-wing is service wing and has 2 projecting gables to left end, 2 flat roofed dormers and mullioned windows. Garden front has 3 projecting gables, each with 2 storey 11 light canted bay with mullioned windows to first floor and mullioned and transomed windows to ground floor and 4 other windows, mainly 3 light mullions to first floor and 3 light mullioned and transomed windows to ground floor but 2 storey 4-light oriel to right of central gable. Between left and central gable is a large external brick chimney stack with clustered brick stacks. Attached to the right-hand end is a 1 storey outbuilding, mainly weatherboarded on brick plinth with Horsham slab roof and continuous casements. Great Hall is panelled throughout in oak plank and muntin panelling. 2 spine beams and ceiling joists have run out stops. Fireplace has deep wooden cornices and 2 Atlantes, probably reused C17 figures. Former Library has panelling up to ceiling height and wooden bolection-moulded fireplace. Dining Room is in the Adam style with fluted pilasters, plastered ceiling and wall panels and wooden fireplace with panel of 6 cupids and frieze of tripods, urns and swags. Staircase Hall has Oak Imperial staircase with strapwork embellished balusters and end piers. Large Dining Room has panelled walls/oval ceiling of early Georgian style and panels with plaster cherubs and stone 4 centred fireplace. Principal bedroom has built-in walnut furniture. Bathrooms have old baths and tiled surrounds. Some bedrooms have wooden fireplaces with tiled surrounds.

2. This building was originally a forge or forges used in connection with the iron industry, for which Sussex was famous before coal was much used as a fuel. It stands on the edge of 2 very large hammer ponds. It has subsequently been used as several cottages but is now one house. Half H-shaped C17 or earlier timber-framed building. The centre is fronted with red brick on the ground floor and weather-boarding above. Two storeys, 3 windows. The north-west wing has the timbering exposed at the north end with brick infilling, but its inner wall is all brick, colour-washed. One storey and attic with dormer windows in hip end of roof. The south-east wing is probably later and is all brick except the first floor on south side. Gable at north-east end of wing. Two storey, one window. Horsham slab roof to the whole. Casement windows. Three doorways with sloping hoods of Horsham slabs.

2. Built in 1823 for Thomas Broadwood. Architect Francis Edwards, but Broadwood is said to have designed the plan of the house. Large castellated mansion. Ashlar. Two storeys. Castellated parapet. The main front faces south-east and has 14 windows. It consists of 2 sections of different heights. The main portion has 7 windows, of which the 3 centre ones project. Octagonal turrets at the angles with loop lights. The remainder to the west, also of 7 windows has a lower elevation. Sash windows with dripstones over, the glazing bars intact in the eastern half of the front. Doorway with pilasters, pediment, semi-circular fanlight and recessed door of 6 fielded panels. Entrance on north-west front 16 windows. Tower of 3 storeys with octagonal turret at north end. Lower octagonal turret towards the centre. Classical porch with pediment. Recessed section without castellation towards south end and projection beyond it. Good example of a castellated mansion.

Half-H. plan. Built of vivid red bricks. Three storeys. Twelve windows. Horsham slab roof. Tall brick chimney stacks. Casement windows. Shaped gables to wings. Centre portion has a 6-storeyed tower with balustrade and a turret corbelled out of its top 3 storeys at north-east corner. Porte cochere to north-east of tower with balustrade over. Stone framed ground floor. windows, 3, 4 or 5 lights with mullions and upper transom. Similar pattern of windows on first floor timber framed with casements. Central entrance doorway in moulded stone arch under gable heads to lateral ground floor access corridor with stone mullioned windows to either side. Panelled double doors with glazed fanlight of square panes above slightly arched transom. Gabled service wing with tile hung first floor to left of the main block. On the right access, the front corridor leads to a single storey stone block with hipped roof and a large mullioned and transomed 5-light bay window on the south side. The east front has a high centre portion of 3 storeys and 3 windows with a cornice over and pediment containing a round window flanked by swags. Behind the pediment is a circular dome with an iron railing round it. Windows in moulded architrave surrounds with glazing bars intact. On each side of the centre portion is a section of 2 storeys and one window each with wide eaves cornice and hipped roof. Very wide square portico forming a porte cochere the whole width of the centre portion of the house with a coupled square and round column at each corner and balustrade over forming a balcony. The north and south fronts have a similar centre portion to the east front but only the width of one window with a gable over. The north wing has 2 storeys and 5 windows.
